**Item 2. Approval of March 8 & 9, 2006 Minutes:**

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Mason to approve the minutes as presented. Motion seconded by Mr. Garis. Motion passes. (Mr. Carne and Mr. Lommori were absent for the vote)

**Item 3. Call for Additional Agenda Items:**

No additional items were added to the agenda.

**Item 4. Agenda Approval:**

Dr. Hughes requested that the agenda be flexible to accommodate individuals who wish to speak to specific items.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Bonine to approve the agenda as presented. Motion seconded by Mr. Perdomo. Motion passes. (Mr. Carne and Mr. Lommori were absent for the vote)

**Item 5. Lifetime Pass Request:**

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Garis to approve all individuals listed for a lifetime pass. Motion seconded by Mr. Mason. Motion passes. (Mr. Carne and Mr. Lommori were absent for the vote)

**Item 6. Current Financial Reports:**

Mr. Beesemyer reviewed the current financial statements for the NIAA, Special Projects, NASC and Certificates of Deposit.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Garis to approve the financial reports as presented. Motion seconded by Mr. Mason. Motion passes.

**Item 7. 2006-2007 Budget Proposal:**

Mr. Beesemyer shared with the Board a first reading of the 2006-2007 budget. The finalized budget with adjustments will be presented for approval at the September 2006 meeting.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Garis to accept the proposal as presented with final approval to be given at the September 2006 meeting. Motion seconded by Mr. Carne. Motion passes.

**Item 8. 2006-2007 Ticket Prices:**

Dr. Hughes made a recommendation that NIAA post-season ticket prices remain the same. Dr. Hughes reviewed the concept of the CIF and stated that they believe they should not lose money for regional / state events.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Garis to keep ticket prices the same as in 2005-2006. Motion seconded by Mr. Bonine. Motion passes. (Mr. Carne and Mr. Lommori were absent for the vote)

**Item 9. T-Shirt Bid:**

Mr. Beesemyer reviewed the bid process and discussed the three bids received for the t-shirt contract.

ACTION: Motion by Coleman to renew the Billy Tees contract. Motion seconded by Mr. Perdomo. Motion passes.

**Item 10. Las Vegas Review Journal Contract:**

Dr. Hughes and Mr. Nelson reviewed the contract and stated it is the same contract the NIAA had for the last three years with the exception of the Addendum which states that should Clark County School District withdraw from the NIAA the LVRJ would have the opportunity to cancel this sponsorship. The contract has been signed by Dr. Hughes.

Mr. Bonine suggest that the NIAA contact northern Nevada newspapers to seek additional sponsorships.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Mason to accept the contract with the Las Vegas Review Journal. Motion seconded by Mr. Bonine. Motion passes. (Mr. Carne & Mr. Lommori were absent for the vote)

**Item 11. Sponsorship for League / Region Standings:**

Mr. Nelson reviewed the nevadaprep.com request for sponsorship and the proposed use of nevadaprep.com as the official standings site of the NIAA.

Mr. Hildebrand proposed increasing his compensation to \$15,000 if the NIAA Board of Control would agree to changing the format of the 1A / 2A / 3A state baseball and softball tournament schedule, would make changes to the selection process for the NIAA Hall of Fame, and would give fair consideration to his alignment proposal.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Carne to propose a 1 year pilot program for \$15,000 for the standings sponsorship, banners and signage with no other strings attached and instructions to evaluation the sponsorship in one year. Motion seconded by Mr. Mason. A roll call vote was taken – 5 No / 3 yes. Motion fails. (Mr. Bonine, Mr. Garis, Mr. Lommori, Mr. Mathis and Mr. Perdomo voted no)

**Item 12. Notice of Revision of Regulations:**

- A. Regulation 386.696 – Out of Season Participation: Dr. Hughes reviewed the policy and the process that has taken place.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Garis to have a four week dead period for all seasons and have the policy go into effect in the fall of 2007 but give coaches an opportunity for input during the school year. Motion seconded by Mr. Perdomo. Motion passes. (Mr. Carne and Mr. Lommori were absent for the vote) (Attachment A)

- B. Regulation 386.718 - 1A Participation Rule: Mr. Strong, 1A Liaison, reviewed the changes and explained that the current policy in NAC does not read the same as the previous handbook.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Garis to approve the proposed changes. Motion seconded by Mr. Bonine. Motion passes. (Mr. Lommori was absent for the vote) (Attachment B)

- C. Regulation 386.746 - Swimming: Dr. Hughes reviewed the reason for this change to be in alignment with the NFHS regulations.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Bonine to approve the proposed change. Motion seconded by Mr. Coleman. Motion passes. (Mr. Lommori was absent for the vote) (Attachment C)

**Item 13: Reconsideration of Foreign Exchange:**

Dr Hughes reviewed the policy as it refers to foreign exchange students and foreign athletes and stated that superintendents are not in support of this change.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Bonine to return to the previous regulation for foreign exchange students as it refers to J-1 Visas. Motion seconded by Mr. Lommori. Motion passes. (Attachment D)

Foreign students not with an exchange program will be considered a transfer student and must complete the necessary transfer appeal / hardship appeal paperwork to participate on the JV level only.

**Item 14. Final approval from Legislative Counsel Bureau:**

Dr. Hughes reviewed the procedure to change a regulation and suggested that we have a handbook review committee that meets prior to each board meeting. The following regulations were not approved by the Legislative Commission and are being presented to the Board for revisions:

A. Regulation 386.702 – Tournaments:

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Bonine to approve the policy as proposed. (Attachment E). Motion seconded by Mr. Garis. Motion passes. (Mr. Lommori was absent for the vote)

B. Regulation 386.786 – One School per Season:

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Bonine to approve the policy with revisions (Attachment F). Motion seconded by Mr. Garis. Motion passes. (Mr. Lommori was absent for the vote)

C. Regulation 386.819 – Physicals:

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Bonine to approve the policy with revisions (Attachment G). Motion seconded by Mr. Garis. Motion passes. (Mr. Lommori was absent for the vote)

**Item 15. Class 3A Football Alignment:**

Mr. Adams explained that this change will affect the 2007 school year only and was initiated by the northern 3A schools. The alignment will be a 2-2 North-South representation henceforth in the 3A state semi-final football bracketing. Mr. Nelson will make the adjustment in the NIAA Reference Manual.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Garis to accept the change. Motion seconded by Mr. Bonine. Motion passes. (Mr. Lommori was absent for the vote)

**Item 16. Tennis:**

Mr. Nelson explained that the proposed changes were made at the Coaches Advisory meeting. The uniform rule would change to include team uniforms. This change will appear in post-season tournament information packets.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Bonine to accept the policy change. Motion seconded by Mr. Carne. Motion passes. (Mr. Lommori was absent for the vote)

18 point scoring system / tie-breaker to be changed. Team tennis matches would break ties by playing a head to head competition round. If they are still tied, they will resume as old tie breaker. This will be a pilot system for one year.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Garis to accept the policy as presented. Motion seconded by Mr. Coleman. Motion passes. (Mr. Lommori was absent for the vote)

Schools not fielding a complete tennis team must travel to the opposing school site regardless of whether they are the home or visitor.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Garis to approve the policy as presented. Motion seconded by Mr. Perdomo. Motion passes. (Mr. Lommori was absent for the vote)

**Item 17. Drug & Alcohol Policy for Student Athletes:**

Dr. Hughes reviewed the Drug & Alcohol Policy and stated that the only change is the addition of an appeal process for students who violate the policy for the third time.

Action: Motion by Mr. Garis to accept the policy as presented. Motion seconded by Mr. Perdomo. Motion passes.

**Item 18. National Federation Travel Allowance for Board Members 2006-2007:**

Dr. Hughes reviewed the travel allowances for the board president and vice president to attend the NFHS Summer meeting in Orlando, Florida and for the board president to attend the Section 7-8 meeting in Salishan, Oregon.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Garis to approve the travel allowances. Motion seconded by Mr. Coleman. Motion passes.

**Item 19. Executive Director / Staff Travel Proposal 2006-2007:**

Dr. Hughes reviewed the proposal for staff travel to various NFHS meetings.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Garis to approve the staff travel allowance. Motion seconded by Mr. Perdomo. Motion passes.

**Item 20. 2006-2007 Liability Insurance:**

Dr. Hughes explained that Jim Ellett solicits different companies for insurance bids and that currently the NIAA has a policy with the Dissinger group. This year's insurance will increase by approximately \$700 with no difference in coverage.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Bonine to accept the Dissinger Insurance coverage. Motion seconded by Mr. Carne. Motion passes.

**Item 21. Nevada Association of Student Councils – Constitution Revisions:**

Dr. Hughes recommended that the Board accept the changes made to the NASC constitution at the May 2006 meeting.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Bonine to accept the NASC constitution changes as presented. Motion seconded by Mr. Perdomo. Motion passes.

**Item 22. 2006-2007 Activity Schedules – Final Revisions:**

Dr. Hughes reviewed the current 2006-2007 activity schedule and reminded the board and liaisons that there are football play-off games scheduled for the Veteran's Day week-end. Mr. Garis also requested that the NIAA look further into the possibility of the tennis season starting one week later, which would make state championships be held over the three day Nevada Day weekend.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Garis to approve the 2006-2007 and 2007-2008 calendar as proposed. Motion seconded by Mr. Bonine. Motion passes.

**Item 23. Durango High School – Warning Status:**

Dr. Hughes reviewed the letter from Durango High School requesting they be removed from warning status.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Mason to accept the original decision and keep Durango on warning status. Motion seconded Mr. Bonine. Motion passes.

**Item 24. Public School / Private School Issues:**

Dr. Hughes reviewed the meetings that have been held and also the forms that will be distributed. Dr. Hughes also stated that meetings will be held at the end of each sport season with the private / public schools.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Bonine to accept the forms as adjusted. Motion seconded by Mr. Lommori. Motion passes.

**Item 25. Personnel Session / Job Descriptions:**

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Carne to go into closed session. Motion seconded by Mr. Lommori. Motion passes.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Bonine to return to open session. Motion seconded by Mr. Lommori. Motion passes.

ACTION: Motion by Coleman to establish a selection committee to assist with a national search for the replacement of the Executive Director when he submits a formal resignation. This committee will include Mr. Mathis; Mr. Lommori, Mr. Carne. The selection committee will make their recommendation and return to the Board. The Board also requested that Dr. Hughes give the board 90 days notice. The Board will provide the selection committee with the criteria for replacing the executive director. Motion seconded by Mr. Lommori. Motion passes.

**Item 26. Finalized Salary Adjustment:**

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Garis to go into closed session. Motion seconded by Mr. Coleman. Motion passes.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Garis to return to open session. Motion seconded by Mr. Lommori. Motion passes.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Coleman to move the Assistant Directors to a range 40, step A on the Clark County Administrators Salary Schedule beginning July 1, 2006. Motion seconded by Mr. Garis. Motion passes.

**Item 27. Approval of Executive Director's Contract:**

The final draft of Dr. Hughes contract was presented to the Board.

ACTION: Motion by Mr. Mason to approve Dr. Hughes contract for 2006-2007. Motion seconded by Mr. Garis. Motion passes.

**DISCUSSION ITEMS:**

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**Item 28. League Reports:**

1A – Mike Strong congratulated the schools who won state titles and the NIAA staff for all they do. New liaison will be selected at league meeting in August.

2A – Bill Darrow thanked Dr. Hughes for the great job he has done and congratulated schools who won state titles. Russell Fecht, Athletic Director at Pershing County High School, will be the new northern 2A president.

3A – Rod Adams stated that Charlie Walsh from Sparks High School will be the new 3A President and Board Liaison. Mr. Adams thanked NIAA for Top Ten Banquet. Mr. Adams also stated that he has learned a lot by being a board liaison and thanked the Board for their help.

Private Schools: Bret Walter stated that he is excited about the future and opening communication with private schools.

4A North - Fred Perdomo: Great softball tournament in Carson; Carson is adding more facilities this year and will have a new athletic director. Eddie Bonine stated that the NADA Conference this year will be held in Anaheim, CA.

4A South – Ray Mathis will be joining Bill Garis' office. CCSD is holding an athletic administrators meeting June 21 to do a thorough training on the drug and alcohol policy for the upcoming school year. CCSD is still looking at adding additional sports in the middle schools and another girl's sport for 2007-2008. CCSD will also be using an 18-hole golf format for boys and girls golf beginning in the fall of 2006.

**Item 29. Litigation Updates:**

There is one Level II appeal pending from Clark County but currently nothing in the courts.

**Item 30. Legal Fees:**

Paul Anderson reviewed the way the NIAA has been billed for his services and stated that the 3 year retainer continues to work well for NIAA. Mr. Anderson has requested an increase in his hourly rate from \$135.00 to \$175.00. It was discussed that Mr. Anderson has not had an increase in pay during his 8 year tenure with the Association. This item will return as an action item at the September meeting

**Item 31. Handbook Review Committee:**

Dr. Hughes reviewed the meeting held May 2, 2006 in Reno and stated that recommendations from this meeting will be discussed in Item 33. Dr. Hughes also recommended that a committee meet a day prior to the board meeting to review all board item regulation changes plus new sections of the NAC. The following individuals will sit on this committee: Paul Anderson, Eddie Bonine, Bill Garis, Ray Mathis, Sally Nieman, and Donnie Nelson.

**Item 32. NIAA Information Pamphlet:**

It was recommended that the NIAA Office staff request bids for the printing and redesigning of the association's informational pamphlet.

**Item 33. Notice of Items for Discussion:**

Dr. Hughes reviewed the regulations presented and stated they would return as action items at the September meeting.

**Item 34. 2007 Wrestling Site Proposal:**

Vince Mendiola, Athletic Administrator at Lowry High School, presented the City of Winnemucca's interest in hosting the 2007 state wrestling tournament. Winnemucca has offered to cover all expenses for the use of the Events Center and any expenses incurred by the NIAA.

It was suggested that northern schools be given an opportunity to bid on hosting this event before a final decision is made. This will return as an action item at the September meeting.

**Item 35. Realignment Organizations**

The first organizational realignment meeting was held on June 13, 2006. The committee made recommendations that they will present at the August meeting. At that time, they will request that the different leagues make recommendations to be presented at the September board meeting. It was recommended that a limit of 3 proposals be presented.

Vince Mendiola asked that the board review Mr. Hidebrand's (nevadaprep.com) alignment recommendations as he believes there are some items that have merit.

**Item 36. Warren Walker Prep Basketball Team Concept:**

Mr. O'Neill, President at Warren Walker, reviewed their prep basketball team concept and stated that Warren Walker wishes to continue as a NIAA member in good standing. Warren-Walker wishes to have recognized by the NIAA a second, independent, high school basketball team which would not be eligible for post-season play. This team would consist of recruited out-of-state players. Warren Walker has been sold to Maritas and their schools are scholarship funded for students. Warren Walker will be providing an IB curriculum program. They will also have new turf fields, a pool and a new building site. This basketball program will be in addition to the regular 1A basketball program. The board recommended that Warren-Walker make a presentation to the Clark County Principal's. This will return as an action item at the September 2006 meeting.

**Item 37. CCSD Swimming:**

Mr. Garis stated that CCSD needs to either scale back their swim program or move the season to the fall due to lack of pool space.

**Item 38. Program Contract:**

Dr. Hughes stated that Kukulski Brothers are no longer able to do state programs and that there is an individual from the Reno area who is interested in doing the programs. This will return as an action item at the September meeting.

**Item 39. Winter Financial Reports:**

Mr. Beesemyer reviewed the winter gate receipts and stated that revenues were up for 2005-2006.

**Item 40. Spring Sport Gate Receipts:**

Mr. Beesemyer reviewed gate receipt information with the board and stated that the state track meet at Reno High School was very successful.

**Item 41. Special Projects / Hall of Fame Game Review:**

Dr. Hughes reviewed the special projects / Hall of fame Game information.

**Item 42. Schedule start Scheduling Program:**

Mr. Beesemyer encouraged schools and school districts to use the Schedule Star program. Clark County stated they would talk to the Schedule Star representatives.

**Item 43. Summer Rules Clinics / Meetings:**

Board members and league liaisons were asked to please remind all athletic administrators / directors and fall coaches of the summer rules clinics and the league meeting dates.

**Item 44. Sudden Impact Concussion Management Program:**

Dr. Hughes reviewed the survey results that were mailed to all NIAA member schools and recommended that all schools who have contact sports also use the this program.

**Item 45. Media Credentialing Procedures:**

Mr. Nelson stated that he will discuss media credentials at the National Federation summer meeting in Orlando, Florida and bring information back to the September meeting.

**Item 46. Top Ten Student Athlete Review:**

Dr. Hughes reviewed the Top Ten Student Athlete process and thanked the board members who attended this special event.

**Item 47. Model Coaches Award:**

Dr. Hughes reviewed the Model Coach Award process and emphasized the importance of recognizing outstanding coaches.

**Item 48. Nevada Coaching Education Update:**

Mr. Beesemyer stated that Dale Norton, Assistant Superintendent from Nye County, has arranged for in-service credit for those coaches taking the Coaching Education class. Mr. Beesemyer will send out credit

information to all instructors. The NIAA will continue working with this program until they have the opportunity to review the new program being presented the NFHS.

**Item 49. 2006 NASC Conference Report:**

As of this date, the report has not been submitted to the NIAA.

**Item 50. Sponsorship Updates:**

Mr. Nelson reviewed the status of NIAA sponsors.

**Item 51. Radio / TV Updates:**

Mr. Nelson stated there was no spring radio coverage for 2006. He also stated that Craig Caiples had contacted the NIAA requesting that he be allowed to re-start the Southern Nevada Game of the Week. It was suggested that he contact Mr. Garis for permission to televise Clark County Schools.

**Item 52. Award of Excellence – Final Results:**

Mr. Nelson reviewed the winners of the 2006 Award of Excellence.

**Item 53. Silver State Spirit Championships Update:**

Dr. Hughes stated that he would have Terrie McNutt attend the September meeting and bring a copy of the Spirit Championship financial report.

**Item 54. 2006 Commissioners Summer Meeting Update:**

The sports commissioners met with the NIAA staff on June 9, 2006 to discuss issues for the 2006-2007 school year. Mr. Beesemyer stated that Terry Tate, SNOA Official, submitted a proposal for a mercy rule in football. This item will return as a discussion item in September.

**Item 55. 2006 NFHS Legal Meeting:**

Dr. Hughes and Mr. Anderson discussed the legal meeting held in Indianapolis in April. A copy of the agenda was presented for the board's review.

**Item 56. National Federation Summer Meeting:**

A copy of the agenda for the summer meeting to be held in Orlando, Florida on June 25 – 29, 2006 was presented for the board's review.

**Item 57. Appeals Update:**

A break down of all appeals was presented to the Board for their review.

**Item 58. Courtesy Card Sales:**

A break down of cards purchased by organization was presented for Board's review.

**Item 59. Related Information:**

Dr. Hughes provided miscellaneous information for the Board's review.

**Item 60. Board Comments / Suggestions for Future Meetings:**

There were no comments from the Board. Dr. Hughes reminded the Board that they can call him at any time to have items added to the agenda.

**Item 61. Public Comments / Suggestions for Future Meetings:**

There were no comments from the public.

**Item 62. NIAA Board of Control Future Meeting Dates:**

The next meeting of the NIAA Board of Control will be held on Wednesday and Thursday, September 13 & 14, 2006 in Reno, Nevada

**Item 63. 2006-2007 NIAA Board of Control:**

Dr. Hughes stated that Keith Roman has been named the Region II replacement for Fred Perdomo. As of this date, no official notice has been given for the replacement of Mark Coleman, Penny Elliott or Bill Garis. The Board did request that Bill Garis be allowed to continue as a 4A liaison to the Board.

ATTACHMENT A:

**NAC 386.696 Restrictions on participation in out-of-season activities relating to sanctioned sport. (NRS 386.430)**

- ~~1. A person shall not require a pupil to participate in any athletic program for a sanctioned sport that is conducted before or after the season for that sanctioned sport.~~
  - ~~2. Each team that participates in a sanctioned sport must be selected, and practices for that team conducted, during the season for that sanctioned sport.~~
  - ~~3. A pupil may engage in any out-of-season activity relating to a sanctioned sport if:~~
    - ~~(a) He engages in that activity voluntarily; and~~
    - ~~(b) The activity is conducted to improve his ability to participate in the sanctioned sport.~~
- (Added to NAC by Nev. Interscholastic Activities Ass'n by R206-03, eff. 11-2-2004)

- 1. A pupil shall not be required to participate in any athletic program for a sanctioned sport that is conducted before or after the season for that sanctioned sport.*
- 2. A pupil may engage in any out-of-season activity relating to a sanctioned sport if:*
  - (a) He engages in that activity voluntarily;*
  - (b) The activity is conducted to improve his ability to participate in the sanctioned sport.*
- 3. Each team that participates in a sanctioned sport must be selected and practices for that team must be conducted during the season for that sanctioned sport.*
- 4. Out-of-season activities shall not consist of inter-school activities of any kind, including competitions, scrimmages or practices.*

ATTACHMENT B:

**NAC 386.718 Basketball: Class 1A teams with fewer than 15 members. (NRS 386.430)**

1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a pupil who is enrolled at a Class 1A school and who participates in basketball as a sanctioned sport may, during the same day, participate in a basketball game for junior varsity players and a basketball game for varsity players. A coach of a basketball team at such a school shall not:

(a) During the same day, allow a pupil who is a member of the team to participate in:

(1) A basketball game for junior varsity players and a basketball game for varsity players if the sole reason for allowing the pupil to participate in the game is to win the game;

(2) A basketball game for junior varsity players if the pupil is a starting member of the basketball team for varsity players at the school; or

(3) More than five quarters during a basketball game; or

(b) Allow a pupil who is in the 12th grade and who is a member of the team to participate in a basketball game for junior varsity players unless, before the game:

(1) The school notifies the Executive Director and the opposing school that the school proposes to allow the pupil to participate in the game; and

(2) The Executive Director approves, in writing, the pupil's participation in the game.

2. If a pupil participates in a basketball game for junior varsity players and a basketball game for varsity players during the same day, the school where the game is conducted shall ensure that the game for junior varsity players is conducted before the game for varsity players.

3. If a team of a Class 1A school participates in a basketball game and the membership of that team consists of junior varsity players and varsity players for the game pursuant to this section, the coach of the team shall, at least 10 minutes before the game:

(a) Identify at least five varsity players who are members of the team for which he is a coach who will not participate in a basketball game for junior varsity players during the same day; and

(b) Submit the name of each pupil identified pursuant to paragraph (a) to the scorekeeper for the game.

4. *If a pupil who is a junior varsity player participates in a basketball game for varsity players pursuant to this section, he shall, during the period in which he participates in the game, wear a jersey that displays a number that is distinguishable from the numbers displayed on the jerseys of the varsity players who participate in the game.* ~~A pupil of a Class 1A school shall not participate in a basketball game for junior varsity players and a basketball game for varsity players during the same day pursuant to this section unless each school against whom the pupil competes during that day agrees to allow the pupil to participate in that manner.~~

5. ~~If a pupil who is a junior varsity player participates in a basketball game for varsity players pursuant to this section, he shall, during the period in which he participates in the game, wear a jersey that displays a number that is distinguishable from the numbers displayed on the jerseys of the varsity players who participate in the game.~~

6. If a dispute arises between two schools relating to a provision of this section, each school shall submit the dispute to its principal or athletic director. If the dispute is not resolved after it is submitted to those principals or athletic directors, the schools shall submit the dispute to the president of the class in which the schools participate. If the dispute is not resolved after it is submitted to the president, the schools shall submit the dispute to the Executive Director.

~~7. The provisions of this section do not apply to a basketball team that consists of 15 or more members.~~

ATTACHMENT C:

**NAC 386.746 Swimming: Generally. (NRS 386.430)**

1. The Board shall establish the date upon which a school may begin practicing for a swimming season at least 2 years before the beginning of the season. Each season ends upon completion of the state tournament for swimming.

2. Each event that is held during a regional or state tournament for swimming must be conducted in the manner specified by the Board and the National Federation of State High School Associations or its successor organization. The Executive Director shall, before each regional or state tournament, provide to each school that participates in the tournament a list setting forth each event for the tournament and the order in which each event will be conducted.

3. A pupil who participates in swimming as a sanctioned sport shall not participate in more than ~~three~~ **four** events during any swim meet, ~~including, without limitation, any relay race~~ **no more than two of which may be individual events.**

4. Each school that enrolls a pupil who participates in swimming as a sanctioned sport at that school shall comply with the rules of swimming adopted by the National Federation of State High School Associations or its successor organization. Each pupil enrolled in that school who participates in swimming as a sanctioned sport shall, if he wishes to establish a record of his performance in that sanctioned sport during a season, comply with those rules during any swim meet in which he participates.

5. The Association will not accept the qualifying times of a pupil for the state tournament for swimming unless the pupil:

- (a) Participates in a regional swimming championship; and
- (b) Obtains those times during that regional championship.

ATTACHMENT D:

**NAC 386.795 Foreign exchange students and international students; penalty. (NRS 386.430)**

1. The provisions of this section govern the eligibility of:
  - (a) A foreign exchange student; and
  - (b) An international student who enrolls in a school and is not a foreign exchange student.
2. The Association will allow a foreign exchange student to participate in a sanctioned sport if the foreign exchange student:
  - (a) Is sponsored by and placed with a host family in the United States by an international student exchange program that:
    - (1) Is approved for listing by the Council on Standards for International Educational Travel or its successor organization;
    - (2) Is recognized by the United States Department of State; and
    - (3) Assigns students to host families in a manner which ensures that a student, school or other interested party is unable to influence the assignment of the student to a host family for athletic or other purposes or in any other manner which ensures that the student is not chosen or placed because of his athletic interests or abilities;
  - (b) Possesses a J-1 Visa issued by the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service;
  - (c) Attends the school on the first day of the school year and enrolls in a foreign exchange program at the school that is conducted for at least 1 year;
  - (d) Is eligible for not more than 1 year at any school or combination of schools in this State or any other state beginning on his initial date of enrollment in a school in the United States;
  - (e) Has not completed the 12th grade or its equivalent in the United States or any other country; and
  - (f ) Complies with any other requirements for eligibility of the Association during the period in which he is a pupil enrolled in a school.
3. If a foreign exchange student transfers to another school during the school year because of a change in residence by the student and the host family with whom he was placed at the time of enrollment in the original school, the transfer does not affect his eligibility to participate in a sanctioned sport. If the transfer occurs because the student is placed with another host family, the student is ineligible to participate in a sanctioned sport at the school to which he transfers for the remainder of the school year.
4. If a school or coach of a school places or arranges for the placement of a student in violation of any provision of this section, the student is ineligible to participate in a sanctioned sport and the Association may impose a penalty against the school or coach pursuant to NAC 386.600 to 386.886, inclusive.
5. A student from a foreign country who is enrolled in a school because he has been issued an F-1 Visa by the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service shall be deemed to be a transfer student. To be eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport, the student must comply with the provisions for eligibility that are applicable to a transfer student. ***To be eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport, the student must comply with the provisions that are applicable to a transfer student, and may participate at the sub-varsity level only.***
6. For the purposes of this section, a foreign exchange student shall be deemed to be placed with a host family if:
  - (a) The school that the student attends was not involved in the selection or assignment of the student; and
  - (b) The principal office for the sponsoring organization approves the placement of the student.
7. As used in this section, "foreign exchange student" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 483.075.

ATTACHMENT E:

**NAC 386.702 Tournaments; wrestling; swimming and diving, substitutions.  
(NRS 386.430)**

1. In addition to any limitation concerning the number of games, contests or meets in which a school or pupil may participate in a sanctioned sport pursuant to NAC 386.699:

(a) A team that participates in a sanctioned sport may participate in not more than two tournaments during a year.

(b) A pupil who participates in wrestling as a sanctioned sport, including, without limitation, a pupil who is a member of the junior varsity team and the varsity team for wrestling during the same season, may participate in not more than 15 contacts during a year.

(c) A ~~pupil who~~ **school that** participates in swimming and diving as a sanctioned sport may participate in not more than 12 competitions during a year.

2. A pupil who participates in a sanctioned sport may substitute not more than:

(a) One tournament for not more than three games, contests or meets for the sanctioned sport; or

(b) Three games, contests or meets for not more than one tournament for the sanctioned sport.

3. As used in this section:

(a) "Competition" means a dual, triangular or quadrangular invitational meet. The term does not include a league, regional or state tournament.

(b) "Contact" means a dual, double dual or triple dual. The term does not include a league, regional or state tournament.

(c) "Tournament" means any contest between more than two teams that participate in a sanctioned sport to determine the winner for the season for that sanctioned sport.

ATTACHMENT F:

**NAC 386.796 Practice or participation by pupil in any sanctioned sport for more than one school during season prohibited; waiver of prohibition. (NRS 386.430)**

1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, a pupil shall not practice or participate in any sanctioned sport for more than one school during the season for the sanctioned sport[-] *including, without limitation, any school that is located outside the State of Nevada regardless of whether that school is an affiliate school.*

2. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, the Executive Director may waive the provisions of subsection 1 if a pupil moves with his parent or legal guardian from the zone of attendance of a school to the zone of attendance of another school during a season.

3. The Executive Director shall not issue a waiver pursuant to subsection 2 if:

(a) The move is completed after more than one-half of the season is completed; or

(b) The pupil to whom the waiver applies:

(1) ~~Participates in a sanctioned sport at the varsity level;~~ *Is dismissed from or is otherwise no longer a member of the team for [the] a sanctioned sport; or*

(2) Is ineligible for any reason to participate in a sanctioned sport at the school from which he transferred.

ATTACHMENT G:

**NAC 386.819 Physical examinations: Requirements for pupils; maintenance and review of records; exemption from requirements. (NRS 386.430)**

1. Each pupil who wishes to participate in any sanctioned sport for the first time:
  - (a) Must submit to a physical examination that is conducted by a physician who is licensed pursuant to chapter 630 of NRS or a homeopathic physician who is licensed pursuant to chapter 630A of NRS; and
  - (b) After completing the physical examination, must be approved for participation in a sanctioned sport by a physician or homeopathic physician specified in paragraph (a) on a form approved by the Association.
2. ~~Each~~ ***Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, each*** pupil who wishes to participate in a sanctioned sport and has complied with the provisions of subsection 1 shall, for each year he participates in a sanctioned sport, complete the form which is approved by the Association for that purpose. If the pupil submits an affirmative response to any question on the form, he must submit to a complete physical examination in accordance with subsection 1 before he is eligible to participate in a sanctioned sport. ***If, on or after the beginning of the 2005-2006 school year, the pupil enrolls in a school as a freshman, he must submit to such an examination for the first and third years in which he participates in ~~the~~ a sanctioned sport.***
3. Each school shall:
  - (a) Maintain a record of each form submitted to the school pursuant to this section; and
  - (b) Ensure that the athletic director, athletic trainer or school nurse reviews each form specified in paragraph (a) before each season in which the pupil participates in a sanctioned sport.
4. If the religious beliefs of a pupil prohibit him from submitting to a physical examination to participate in a sanctioned sport, the pupil and a parent or legal guardian with whom he resides shall execute a release which indemnifies and holds harmless the school, school district and Association from all liability which may arise because of the pupil's participation in the sanctioned sport.
5. A pupil may obtain the form for the release specified in subsection 4 from the Association.
