2007 NIAA 4A NORTHERN REGION GIRLS GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP

Here are final results from the 2007 NIAA Class 4A Northern Region Girls Golf Championship tournament played October 9 & 10 over the 5,115-yard (red tees), par-72 Red Hawk Lakes Course. The top two (2) teams * and the top five (5) individuals ^ from non-qualifying teams advanced to the state championship tournament. The 2007 NIAA Class 4A Nevada State High School Girls Golf Championship tournament, presented by the Las Vegas Review-Journal and Farmers Insurance Group, is scheduled to be played October 15 and 16 at the Canyon Gate Country Club in Las Vegas.

The 2007 NIAA Class 4A Northern Region Girls Golf Championship tournament is scheduled to be played Tuesday, October 9 (first round) and Wednesday, October 10 (final round) over the 5,115-yard (red tees) Resort at Red Hawk's Lakes Course in Wingfield Springs / Sparks.

The top four (4) teams out of the High Desert League and the top four (4) teams out of the Sierra League, based on final Nevada Cup (regular-season) point standings, qualified for this region championship tournament. The top five (5) individuals from non-qualifying teams out of the High Desert League and the top five (5) individuals from non-qualifying teams out of the Sierra League, based on final Nevada Cup (regular-season) point standings, also qualified for this region championship tournament.

The top two (2) teams and the top five (5) individuals plus ties from non-qualifying teams out of this region championship tournament will advance to the 2007 Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association's Class 4A Nevada State High School Girls Golf Championship tournament, presented by the Las Vegas Review-Journal and Farmers Insurance Group. The state tournament is scheduled to be played October 15 & 16 at Canyon Gate in Las Vegas.

LOCATION

The Resort at Red Hawk Golf Club is located at 6600 North Wingfield Springs Parkway in Sparks (zip 89436). The resort's central phone number is 626-6000.

Generally, visitors should take Interstate 80 into the east area of Sparks, exit north at Vista Blvd. and follow approximately 7.5 miles straight into the Wingfield Springs community. Turn left at the four-way intersection (at the end of golf holes on both sides of the road) to find the golf shop. Please park in the main / general lot northeast of the golf shop and NOT in front of the driving range area.

UNIVERSAL TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURES

(Qualifying for the Region Tournament)

4A Northern Region (Nevada Cup point standings)

1. The Nevada Cup point standings of teams/individuals in designated region matches shall determine the top four teams / top five individual qualifiers per league for the region tournament. The region's administrators will determine the Nevada Cup point standings based on previously approved schedules. In the event of a tie, the tie shall be broken using the procedures outlined in this section.

2. Tie between two (2) teams

A. Teams will add their scores from all Nevada Cup matches to determine a total team score. The lowest total score wins. If both teams do not have a complete set of team scores, the team with the most team scores (most matches played) earns the higher seed.

B. Teams will add the scores of their sixth players from all Nevada Cup matches to determine a total sixth-player score. The lowest total score wins. If both teams do not have a complete set of sixth scores, the team with the most sixth scores earns the higher seed.

C. Teams will compare their performances in all individual Nevada Cup events to determine which team had the greater number of higher place finishes. The team with the greater number of higher place finishes earns the higher seed.

D. If the tie remains, teams will compare their performance in the final Nevada Cup event. The team with the lowest team score will earn the higher seed.

3. Tie between three (3) or more teams

A. In all cases of ties involving more than two teams, as each team is advanced from the tie, all other tied teams revert back to head-to-head to break the tie and the process continues.

B. Teams will add their scores from all Nevada Cup matches to determine a total team score. The lowest total score wins. If all teams do not have a complete set of team scores, the team with the most team scores (most matches played) earns the highest seed.

C. Teams will add the scores of their sixth player(s) from all Nevada Cup matches to determine a total sixth-player score. The lowest total score wins. If both teams do not have a complete set of sixth scores, the team with the most sixth scores earns the highest seed.

D. Teams will compare their performances in all individual Nevada Cup events to determine which team had the greatest number of higher place finishes. The team which had the greatest number of higher place finishes will receive the highest seed.

Example (Match No. and place), (only four matches used in example):

Team A, No. 1=6th, No. 2=4th, No. 3=5th, No. 4=4th

Team B, No. 1=4th, No. 2=7th, No. 3=8th, No. 4=5th

Team C, No. 1=5th, No. 2=5th, No. 3=4th, No. 4=6th

Result: Team A won two (2) matches between the tied teams, Team B won one (1) match between the tied teams and Team C won one (1) match between the tied teams. Team A is granted the higher seed (while Team B and Team C go back into the head-to-head tie-breaker).

E. If the tie remains, teams will compare their performance in the final Nevada Cup event. The team with the lowest team score will earn the highest seed.

NIAA GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION, cont.

2. Teams will consist of a maximum of six (6) players, but teams must have a minimum of five (5) scorecards signed and turned in after each round to post a team score.

3. The region tournament will be a two-day, 36-hole event playing the red tees (5,115 yards). A team's best five (5) scores each day will count to determine the team score. Players must turn in a signed scorecard after each round to qualify for individual honors.

4. The championship will be governed by the USGA's "2007 Rules of Golf", the NIAA Handbook, the NIAA Reference Manual, this tournament packet and the local rule sheet published specifically for this tournament. This tournament information packet is a binding document for the rules and regulations of the tournament.

5. No substitutions will be allowed after the start of the tournament, even in the case of injury or illness. A team may play with five or fewer players, but it must have five scores turned in after each round to qualify for the team competition.

6. In the case of inclement weather, darkness or any other unforeseeable delay(s) on the first day of competition, any player not completing her first round shall finish the following morning. The second round of the tournament shall begin when all golfers have finished their first round. It is, however, the tournament director's discretion to complete the first round and start the second round as needed depending on weather, darkness or any other unforeseeable delay(s).

Should weather, darkness, etc., not allow for the completion of the second round, final team and individual scores will be based on the results, in preference, of a) the 27-hole totals, b) the 18-hole totals, c) the 9-hole totals, provided every player in the field has completed that 9-hole increment.

In the event the tournament has to be postponed, it will be rescheduled for the earliest date possible. In the event the tournament cannot be rescheduled, team and individual qualifiers for the state tournament will be determined by Nevada Cup point standings. Thus, the regular-season Nevada Cup points champion from each league plus the top five individuals from non-qualifying teams out of each league will advance to the state tournament.

7. The individual golfer will be responsible for a competitor's scorecard as well as running a check of her own. Monitors will not be asked to make rulings. USGA officials will be on the course for rulings.

8. Distance-measuring devices are NOT permitted during the 2007 NIAA post-season (region and state championship) tournaments.

9. First-round pairings will be determined by Nevada Cup point standings with top-seeded players playing together in the early groups. Final-round pairings will be based upon the INDIVIDUAL results of the first round with the leaders playing together in the late groups. The Tournament Director and NIAA will attempt to avoid having two competitors from the same team/school play in the same group.

10. No practice round will be played. Any team or individual playing the course within a seven-day period (October 2-8) prior to the start of the tournament will be penalized as follows:

A. A two-stroke penalty will be assessed to any individual playing the course during the blackout period. Individual members of the hosting club (in the case of a private club or annual membership) are NOT exempt from this penalty.

B. A 10-stroke penalty (two per scoring team member) will be assessed to teams playing the course during the blackout period. Any school using the course as its home course WILL be exempt from this restriction.

C. A school may not host a tournament at the championship course during this seven-day blackout period.

Competitors are permitted to use all practice facilities. Competitors are also permitted to walk the course at any time PRIOR to the start of the tournament, but competitors must NOT carry with them any equipment (balls, clubs, etc.). Any breach of Rule No. 9 (swinging a club on the tee box, fairway or rough, rolling balls on the green, etc.) will result in a penalty.

11. A region tournament cannot be held on the same course as the state tournament.

12. The use of a motorized cart must be approved by the NIAA.

13. ***Nevada Coaching Regulation:***

NOTE: Spectators are allowed on the course but are NOT permitted to offer advice to a player during a round. Spectators must sign the release/waiver/rules acknowledgement form prior to entering the course.

Coaching will be permitted in the 4A region and state golf tournaments. Coaches must adhere to the following criteria:

A. Coaching will be permitted between holes only (defined as after a specific player has holed out and/or before she has struck the ensuing tee shot).

B. The coach must be approved through his/her respective school, administration and/or district. The coach may be required to wear/display a nametag/badge identifying him/her as the approved on-course coach.

C. Only one (1) coach may coach during the event.

C1. In the spirit of the coaching rule, players are at no time to be coaches. Once a competitor has completed her round, she shall become a spectator (subject to the restrictions of a spectator and fellow "competitor") and will thus not be permitted to offer advice to teammates still out on the course. The penalty for offering advice to a teammate or any other competitor while play is in progress shall be two strokes per incident in accordance with the USGA's rule book as determined by the tournament director and verified tournament's rules committee.

D. It is imperative that coaches do not slow the pace of play. Slow play will be penalized per USGA rules.

E. No teaching aid or other technology will be allowed on the course. This would include, but not be limited to, **distance measuring devices**, radios, cell phones, video cameras, etc.

F. If a coach or spectator violates any of these rules, he/she will be asked to immediately return and remain at the clubhouse. The school will then lose all coaching privileges for the remainder of the tournament.

NOTE: Each team is requested to bring one, preferably two, monitors each day to work the region tournament.

14. Lunches will NOT be provided. Please have your coaches / student-athletes make arrangements for all snacks / meals / beverages.

NIAA IN-TOURNAMENT TIE-BREAKER

I. Girls golf will follow the rules and regulations of the NIAA Handbook and the United States Golf Association.

Ties involving teams during tournament play

A. The aggregate stroke score of the five (5) lowest 18-hole scores for each team, each day, shall constitute their school's team score. Ties for the championship and/or runner-up trophies will be handled in accordance with NIAA playoff procedures described below.

1. If the total of the low five (5) scores each day results in a tie after 36 holes, the lowest (two-day total) score of the sixth person(s) on the team will determine the winner. It is possible in a two-day tournament that the sixth-place finisher could be two different team members. If one team does not have a sixth score and the other team does, the team with the sixth score wins.

2. If the sixth person(s) are also tied, all six players from each team will play one hole of sudden victory. Each team will count its lowest five (5) scores on this hole with the lowest total winning. If the total of the five scores are the same, the lowest score of the sixth player on the sudden victory hole will determine the winner.

If the score of the sixth player also results in a tie, the teams will play another hole and proceed with the tie-breaking procedure as outlined above. This procedure will continue until a winner is determined.

Ties involving individual medalists

A. Only ties for the top medalist (first place) will be broken by a sudden victory playoff. Other ties for medals will be determined by matching scorecards, as recommended by the USGA and outlined below:

1. The player with the best/lowest score on the back nine, second day only, will earn the higher/better finishing place.
2. If a tie remains, the player with the best/lowest score on the final six holes, second day only, will earn the higher/better finishing place.
3. If a tie remains, the player with the best/lowest score on the final three holes, second day only, will earn the higher/better finishing place.
4. If a tie remains, the player with the best/lowest score on the 18th hole, second day only, will earn the higher/better finishing place.

Note: In the event multiple tees are used to start the tournament (split tees / shotgun), the last nine holes will be Nos. 10-18 on the scorecard, the last six will be Nos. 13-18 on the scorecard, etc. At all times, the last nine holes will be represented by Nos. 10-18 on the scorecard.

COMMENTS

As of this packet's printing, competitors (like coaches and spectators) will not be permitted to use distance measuring devices anywhere on the course at any time during the tournament. Competitors (like coaches and spectators) may, however, use distance measuring devices anywhere on the course and at any time prior to the start of the tournament proper (first tee time on first day).
